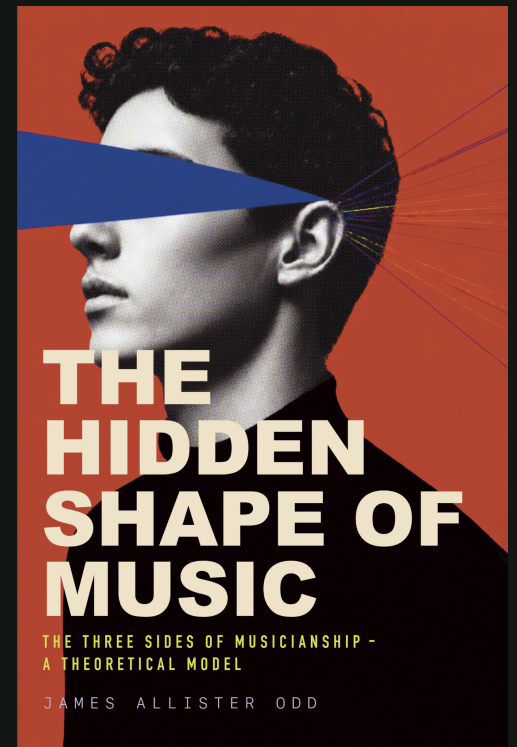

He leads NTRLNK and founded OMAT Institute, where he develops the proposed Musical Aptitude Triad: a framework describing tonal, performative, and expressive dimensions of musicianship. He is the author of *The Hidden Shape of Music* and a guide to cricket.

Odd is the author of *The Hidden Shape of Music* and *The American Guide to the Laws of Cricket*. Across his professional and research work, he is concerned with how evidence is separated, tested, interpreted, and communicated without reducing a complex record to one convenient conclusion.

James Allister Odd is a Pacific Northwest-based investigator, digital-forensics examiner, interdisciplinary researcher, photographer, and author. He leads NTRLNK, an Oregon investigative and forensic practice serving attorneys, organizations, insurers, and private clients. His professional work spans more than sixteen years across investigation, digital forensics, complex evidence analysis, litigation support, federal program leadership, and expert-witness work. Odd founded OMAT Institute as an independent research program at the meeting point of music, information, and cognition. Its central proposal, the Musical Aptitude Triad, describes tonal, performative, and expressive dimensions of musicianship while treating accumulated developmental breadth and depth separately. The public questionnaire and related tools are exploratory instruments designed to make the theory inspectable and testable; they are not validated, normed, diagnostic, predictive, or selection-ready assessments. Odd is the author of *The Hidden Shape of Music: The Three Sides of Musicianship - A Theoretical Model* and *The American Guide to the Laws of Cricket*. His broader work includes academic research in digital forensics and investigative methodology, Pacific Northwest photography, and selected publishing and archival projects.
